

Impartiality

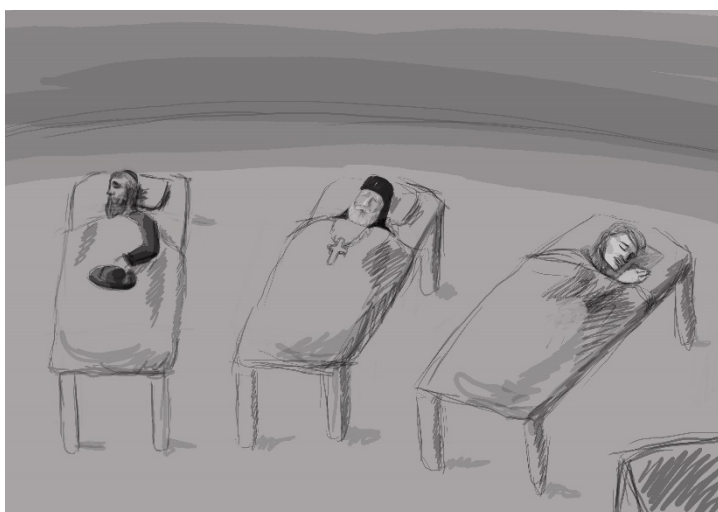


1) In the course of an armed conflict numerous civilians of widely differing origin are injured and wounded. In order to help alleviate this human suffering, medics have set up a field hospital. It is located in a place that is at least partially protected from the conflict, so that now all (!) of the wounded and injured can receive treatment.



2) The conflict has produced many injured, which places the medics under a great deal of pressure as they try to give proper treatment to all of the injured. In addition, there is an extreme shortage of medical supplies.

A medic rushes over to the hospital and enters. He is carrying medical supplies required for the injured, wounded and sick.



3) The hospital is filled with many different people who are being treated irrespective of their origin or ethnic background: to the left is a Jewish rabbi, in the middle is a Christian priest, and the person to the right is a simple civilian, whose ethnic background and origin are not discernible at first glance.



4) The medic takes the medical supplies that he brought with him for the injured and wounded and begins putting them to use in the hospital.



5) All (!) of those who were injured or wounded in the conflict are treated using the same medical supplies. It makes no difference where they come from or which of the parties to the conflict they belong to. All of the injured and wounded are treated equally.
